- Check who the Fire Warden(s) and First Aid contact(s) are. Make sure you have their contact details in case of emergency.
- Most importantly, don't panic if an emergency does arise! Keep calm and evacuate the building as swiftly as possible.

Reporting incident or injury

- Advise your manager of any illness or allergies you have, such as asthma. Keep them
 informed of any changes in your condition.
- If an incident or injury occurs, report it to your manager.
- Most importantly, follow up on any incident or injury.
